

In 2015, Noah Strycker became the first person to observe more than half of the planet's bird species in a single, year-long, birding trip to seven continents. Carrying only a pack on his back, Strycker enlisted the support of local birders to tick more than 6,000 species.

Strycker will share his inspiring story and humorous anecdotes at this free and open to the public presentation certain to leave you with a new appreciation for birds and birders of the world.
